






Incarnation

1. A **mystery** celebrated by the Church (because it is a mystery, we will not totally understand it until we are in Heaven with God)
2. Jesus, who is God, became human to save us; The Word (Jesus) became flesh
3. He is fully human and fully God; not a mix of the two or half-and-half, but fully both
4. Because Jesus is human, he fully understands our lives as humans.

Jesus, Emmanuel

In announcing Jesus' birth, The Gospel of Matthew (1:23) quotes Isaiah 7:14 is quoted. This is where the Prophet Isaiah tells King Ahaz (or King Aha as Mark Hart calls him) that his wife will conceive a son and they will name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." This is the perfect description for Jesus, the Son of God, who fully shares our humanity. Matthew's Gospel ends with the risen Jesus restating that same promise to his disciples, "I am with you always."
